The Branch recently welcomed and accepted the invitation for representation on the MPSC **Shire-wide Thematic Environmental History Project**. This is a six month project which proposes to look at some 800 entries in the Australian Government Themes with a view to categorising relevant shire properties into these themes for legislation in the MPSC Planning scheme.
